FPCE survey snapshot

In February, FPCE took a survey of those in attendance on Sunday mornings in the Sanctuary.

These results are by no means a complete description of who we are at FPCE, but they help us take a "snapshot" of where we're at and what we can do to be a church to Evanston and the surrounding area.

FPCE Demographics - Age

Boomers (ages 54 to 72) make up 40% of the congregation. Those over 72 years of age account for 20% of those that attend the 9 am service compared to just 7% of 11:30 am service. Those that serve at the church at least once per month are also much more likely to be 72+, and 70% of those who serve regularly are age 54+. Newcomers to the church are much more likely than average to be Millennials (22-37), who make up 12% of the total congregation but account for 30% of those who have been attending for less than 1 year. By contrast, those age 54+ make up 57% of the congregation but only 27% of newcomers. Non-members are about 5 times as likely to be Millennials than are members (29% vs. 6%).
